Overview

The Summer Internship Placement Process of the Postgraduate Programme in Management (PGP) batch of 2013-15 of Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad (IIM-A), was successfully completed in November 2013. The students of this batch will pursue their summer internships during April and May 2014.

Summer placements at IIM-A follow a cohort-cluster based approach in which firms offering similar roles are grouped into cohorts and a selected number of cohorts are invited to campus to carry out recruitments during a particular cluster.

Classification by sector

A total of over 110 firms participated in the summer placement process, offering opportunities in various sectors and functions. The global investment banks that recruited students from the batch included Bank of America Merrill Lynch, Barclays, Citibank, Goldman Sachs, JP Morgan, Morgan Stanley, Nomura, Royal Bank of Scotland, Standard Chartered, and UBS. Banks and financial institutions such as Altisource-Ocwen, American Express, and World Bank also recruited from IIM-A.

Recruiters in the consulting space included global strategy consulting firms as well as niche consulting firms: AT Kearney, Accenture, Bain & Company, Booz & Company, McKinsey & Company, Parthenon, The Boston Consulting Group, among others. Among conglomerates, recruiters such as Aditya Birla Group, CK Birla, GE, Mahindra, and TAS recruited students for their management leadership programmes.

In the consumer goods and services sector, the list of recruiters included Airtel, Asian Paints, Hindustan Unilever, ITC, Johnson & Johnson, Mars, Mondelez, among others. Firms from the pharmaceutical sector such as Abbott, Boehringer Ingelheim, Cipla, and Dr. Reddy's offered roles across various functions. In the technology, Internet, and e-commerce sectors, the recruiters included Amazon, Flipkart, Google, Infibeam, Intel, Microsoft, Zovi, among others.

Students also chose to pursue internships in social and regulatory roles, and recruiters offering such roles included SEBI and Anandwan. A few students chose to intern with start-up firms that participated in the Entre Fair organised on campus on October 12, 2013.

Classification by function

A job function refers to the descriptive title given to the professional role a candidate takes up on the job. The top three job functions were consulting (23.81 per cent), finance (20.9 per cent), and marketing/sales (18.78 per cent).

A significant number of finance roles were offered by BFSI firms. In addition, some fast-moving consumer goods (FMCG) companies and conglomerates also recruited for roles in corporate finance. Roles in marketing/sales were offered by firms belonging to the conglomerates, FMCG,



pharmaceutical, and technology sectors. Operations roles were offered by firms belonging to the FMCG, information technology, manufacturing, and pharmaceutical sectors.

The IPRS Initiative

The Indian Placement Reporting Standard (IPRS) is an initiative that aims to provide transparency and authenticity in placement reporting across B-schools, through the means of audited placement reports.
